



## Kensington LiquidAUX Deluxe

auxiliary car kit • \$79



Mount your iPhone or iPod on a gooseneck emanating from your car's charging port so that your device is easily within reach while driving, and then mount a small remote right to the steering wheel so you've got even easier access to playback functions. Comes with a cable for connecting to your car stereo's aux-in port. Also available without the gooseneck for \$20 less.

## Monster iCarCharger 1000

charger + aux • \$49



This car charger offers a pair of innovations: the aux cable (for plugging into your car's aux-in port, if it has one) winds up inside the charger to reduce cable clutter, and the front face of the charger offers playback controls. It might be the perfect aux/charging product if the controls were more reachable by the driver in most cars. Still a winner though.

## NewerTech 3 in 1 Cable

sync cable + aux • \$15



For those who already have a car charger, this Y-shaped cable connects your charger, your iPhone or iPod, and the aux-in port on your car stereo (if it has one). What makes this such a great offering is its price, as iPhone/iPod aux output rarely comes this cheap (you can get a third party car charger for as little as \$10). Can also be used at home with portable speakers.

## NewerTech Auto Charger

This otherwise fairly generic car charger does offer two things not often found on similarly priced competing products: a choice of black or white, and an included sync cable – the latter of which will save you from having to carry your iPhone's or iPod's included cable back and forth to the car. But generally speaking, there are better options at this price point.
